Q:What's the latest news on the bridge?

A: The bridge that will connect the East Cape with the new Calle Centenario of San José is a mega-project designed to overcome the isolation of the Playita area and avoid the damages that several of its communities periodically suffer during the rainy season. The project was tackled by several parties: Puerto Los Cabos, Mayan Palace, Punta Gorda, the state government and the federal government, represented by the Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes. The state government, which is leading the bridge project, selected the construction company through a public

A state-of-the-art repair yard ... Right here at the marina

The days of having to send your boat home from Mexico for repairs will soon be over. Construction is set to begin on a full-service, state-of-the-art repair yard in the Marina at Puerto Los Cabos. Everything from engine and shaft work to electrical repairs and fine joinery will be available without leaving the premises.

The haulout yard will be built and operated by Marine Group Boat Yards, whose renowned San Diego facility attracts world-class yachts from as far away as Europe and Asia. Marine Group's famed 665-ton travelift, the largest of its type in the United States, will be duplicated at Puerto Los Cabos and capable of hauling yachts up to 150 tons.
